Many people lost their lives on September 11. Firefighters, police officers, and other helpers worked very hard to save as many people as they could. Many of them were heroes that day.

Every year, on September 11, people remember those who were lost and honor the heroes. There are special ceremonies, and people often visit the places where the attacks happened to leave flowers or say a prayer. It's a day to think about how important it is to be kind, help others, and stay strong together.
